CSSE, Northern Light Chapter and Safe Saskatchewan, are working in partnership to host a complimentary breakfast meeting on Tuesday, May 15, 2018 from 7:30 to 9:00 am in Hall E, Prairieland Park, 503 Ruth Street West, Saskatoon.

When it comes to health and safety at the workplace, they're doing a lot of things correct-Iv at the Saskatchewan Research Council (SRC). In 2004, a new strategy was implemented at SRC that aimed at empowering employees so they could put safety and occupational health as top priority. This resulted in some projects missing deadlines, or losing some projects altogether. It also meant added spending for proper training and equipment. "Our executive team has been trying to get out and demonstrate that we do care about employees' well-being," president and CEO, Laurie Schramm said. "It's not just something the communications team or a lawyer said we should do. This definitely is not a fad. It's something we're doing for the long haul. Employee's health and safety has always been the most important thing. Our company is doing really important work for our province... but I don't think anything is more important than keeping everyone safe and healthy. That comes first."

The health and safety strategy developed back in 2004 seems to be working, as SRC has been recognized with two Mission: Zero Awards: one in 2016 as the winner in the large employer category and another in 2017, as a finalist. The Mission: Zero Awards were created to recognize inspiring examples of leadership and innovation in health and safety in Saskatchewan. They are awarded to those workplaces that demonstrate a sustained improvement in their injury rate over time and that influence a transformation in their organizational culture so that injury prevention is a core value.

On May 15th, Sunil Sohani, SRC's Safety Services Manager, will provide insight into the Saskatchewan Research Council's health and safety journey.
